


We Believe...


- A K-12 curriculum designed to meet the individual needs of all students including gifted and talented, at-risk, special needs, and alternative education pupils.

East Kentwood High School is a Michigan Blue Ribbon School

- We offer CCNA (Certified Cisco Network Administrator) technology certification
- Twelve Advanced Placement classes for college credit the largest number of AP courses of the 20 school districts in Kent County
- Four years of study in German, Spanish, Latin, and French
- Numerous opportunities for students to participate in extracurricular activities including:
 - Twenty-four performing arts groups in band, choir, and orchestra
 - Major productions of plays and musicals
 - A high school marching band of 270-plus members which is one of the largest high school bands in the state
 - Twenty-seven varsity sports with 61 teams offering a balance in boys and girls sports
 - Intramural sports programs for grades 6-12
 - Exciting dance and sideline cheer with competitive opportunities
- All district buildings continue to achieve Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) under state and federal No Child Left Behind guidelines
- East Kentwood High School received the Governor's Cup for the most MEAP award winners in the OK Red Conference

- The implementation of the <u>trimester class</u> <u>schedule</u> allows students to meet all the Michigan graduation requirements and have ample time to schedule classes in many elective areas.
- Crossroads is our new alternative high school building for students who prefer a learning environment with a comprehensive curriculum within a smaller setting.
- Kentwood's diverse student body continually wins competitive awards in athletics, academics, choral groups, band, orchestra, and debate.
- Between 70% to 75% of our graduating seniors continue on to attend a college or university.
 A significant portion receives scholarships for academics, fine arts, and athletics. The class of 2006 received well over \$2.4 million in scholarships and grants!
- A freshman campus dedicated to the developmental and social skill areas of 13-14 year-old students within a rigorous academic setting
- Many of our students choose Kent Career/Technical Center classes to expand real world career opportunities such as internships directly in the health care fields, management information systems, electronics, and <u>many</u> other high demand career fields.





Have You Heard?

East Kentwood High School graduates are currently attending such prestigious institutions as Harvard, Yale, Notre Dame, Cambridge, the United State Air Force Academy, West Point Military Academy, Purdue, University of Michigan, Michigan State, Western Michigan, University of Illinois and many other <u>excellent institutions</u>.

All Kentwood elementary and middle schools are equipped with FutureKids and Fast ForWord Computer labs. Our state MEAP test scores in math, reading, science, and writing are consistently well above (80%+) county and state averages. Our bands, choirs, orchestras, debate team, and American Political Thought team hold prominent state and national rankings.

There is a 24-hour, online parent/guardian access to student grades, attendance records and homework assignments. Teachers K-12 are using a standards-based reporting system with all students in the district. This enhances accountability and support from staff, students, and parents. We are one of the very few school districts in the nation to use this parent friendly K-12 reporting system!

Grand Rapids Magazine ranks our school system in the top 25% among 29 school districts in West Michigan. This ranking was based upon performance, funding priorities, school environment, and community involvement using 21 different criteria!

Thanks To The Community, Kentwood Public Schools Are In Excellent Shape

Our community has continually supported us. Most recently, an \$85.5 million bond was passed. All 17 buildings (11 elementary, 3 middle school, 9th grade building, 10-12, alternative high school) are state of the art! Our ten-year Building and Site millage is dedicated to keeping these buildings and facilities in excellent shape through 2016.

This is all made possible by the foresight and dedication of the citizens of Kentwood.




Our Facilities...




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
