

Bus drivers, cafeteria workers, paraprofessionals, academic interventionists, custodial staff, grounds crew, safety staff, behavior specialists, office staff, media clerks, and health aides are just some of the critical support staff roles in KPS.

"Each school facility and department is supported by our dedicated support services staff," says Executive Director of Finance and Business Operations Todd Bell. "The members of our support team work tirelessly to create access to resources and opportunities at each building across our district to achieve our vision of Excellence and Equity in Education."

Bell knows that support staff members impact students'

lives each and every day. "In many instances," Bell says, "a student's first encounter and last encounter at school each day is with a support staff member. It could be a bus driver, crossing guard, custodian, or building secretary. The value of our support staff in Kentwood Public Schools cannot be

overstated. They are, simply put, the best in the business."

Support staff members bring specialized skills and knowledge to their work. When safely transporting students to and from school, making sure the registration process is smooth and complete, giving that extra bit of support with academics to students, or making sure students receive healthy meals on a consistent basis, their assigned jobs are critical to student success.



While their work is meaningful, the little extra things they do throughout the day often make the biggest differences for students.

"Our support staff members are not only standouts in their official jobs," says Bell, "they are also the experts when a locker gets jammed or when a parent needs to be called. They are 'change-a-tire' experts, 'help clean up my spilled lunch' experts. They are experts in their dedication to the


KEESHA GRANT EMBODIES EXCELLENCE AT ENDEAVOR

Whether walking the halls, covering lunch duty, or processing with students, they are constantly engaging with our students and helping prepare them for success.



MRS. SIMMONS MAKES A DIFFERENCE

There are many positions within the educational community that support the learning and academic development of our scholars, but there is one position that has risen within these past few years to be a vital, if not key, component of our daily routine at Meadowlawn Elementary. Dyana routinely puts in over 10,000 steps a day, answering the calls to help. The relationships she has built with scholars are so strong that they often seek her out to share their triumphs and bask in the pride she feels when they succeed."

"Recently, Dyana was out for two weeks for a family emergency. While living through her own difficult moment, her scholars were still in her mind and at the very core of her heart.
