## The Community

Kentwood Public Schools are located in southeast Kent County, only 15 to 20 minutes from the heart of downtown Grand Rapids. Kentwood is a very diverse community both economically and demographically.

## The School District

The goal of Kentwood Public Schools is to provide all students with an excellent, quality education so that they can master essential skills and become successful, productive citizens.

The district houses its K-12 enrollment of 8,860 students in ten elementary schools (grades K-5), three middle schools (grades 68, and a high school, which is comprised of a Freshman Campus and a $10^{\text {th }}-12^{\text {th }}$ grade facility ( 2 buildings located on a single site).

The student body is international and diverse, with students originating in 89 different countries speaking 83 languages. English Language Learners make up 20\% of the students in the district.

## The High School

East Kentwood High School offers a comprehensive program intended to prepare students for college and employment. There are approximately 2800 students in grades 9-12. Students are encouraged to take a curriculum to prepare them for postsecondary education. Our students have an opportunity to participate in dual enrollment, vocational education at Kent Career Technical Center or Kent Transitions Center, and online learning opportunities.

EKHS is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

In 2018, approximately 69\% of EKHS's graduates enrolled in advanced degree-granting institutions, with $35 \%$ attending community college and $34 \%$ attending a 4 -year college.

## Vision Statement

All graduates of East Kentwood High School will be inspired to excellence and life-long learning, educated for intellectual and cultural competency, and empowered to reach their full potential as productive self-directed members of society.

## Curriculum

More than 150 courses in 12 departments are offered, including Advanced Placement courses in all core departments, art and computer science. Students traditional take six classes per day. For the 2020-21 school year, students had the option of remote or in-person learning.

## Graduation Requirements

Each semester class is worth .5 credits. Students must meet the Michigan Merit Curriculum expectations, which generally include the subjects listed below. A few students are eligible for a personal curriculum to modify these requirements.

English - 4 credits
Science-3 credits
Mathematics - 4 credits
Social Sciences - 3 credits
World Language-2 credits for class of 2016 and beyond
Visual, Performing, Applied Arts - 1 credit
Physical Education -- .5 credit
Health -- .5 credit

## Testing Program and Results

In the state of Michigan, all Juniors are required to take the SAT as part of the M-Step state assessment. All Sophomores take the PSAT-10 in the spring as well. Approximately 50 students take the NMSQT/PSAT test in October.

We do not have enough students who take the ACT test to report a meaningful mean score.

## Grading Policy

EKHS closed per Governor Whitmer's executive order on 3/13/20, and remained closed through the end of the 2019-2020 school year. All students learned remotely during this time. Students who earned passing marks received $2^{\text {nd }}$ semester grades of either Credit (CR) or the letter grade they had at the time of the shutdown. A formula determined which would more positively impact each individual student's GPA. We have returned to our standard grading policy for 2020-21 and beyond.

Courses following the College Board defined curriculum and designated as AP in the course description book will be weighted an additional 1 point when computing GPA. The GPA on student transcripts reflects a weighted GPA, which is also used for class rank.

## Advanced Placement Courses

Our AP program is open enrollment, with teacher recommendations, but not requirements. During the spring of 2020, 380 students took 729 exams in 21 areas and $72 \%$ of the scores were equal to or higher than 3.
