

Under a clear blue sky with a bit of a chill in the air, East Kentwood High School celebrated the class of 2023




at Falcon Stadium on May 25. In the presence of thousands of family members, friends, and proud Kentwood Public Schools staff, 592 graduates took part in the ceremony. There was plenty to celebrate as the graduates successfully finished their careers at Kentwood Public Schools and looked with anticipation toward their futures.

Fifty-nine of the EK class of '23 graduated Cum Laude, with a grade point average within the 3.5 to 3.79 range. Forty-seven students graduated Magna Cum Laude, with a grade point average in the 3.8 to 3.99 range. Seventy-six students graduated Summa Cum Laude, completing their courses of study at East Kentwood High School with a grade point average of 4.0 or higher. Collectively these students demonstrated excellence in academics.

The evening kicked off with the traditional procession of students into a packed Falcon Stadium as the strains of "Pomp and Circumstance" filled the air. The ceremonies began with students and guests watching this video highlighting the essence of what it means to be a student at East Kentwood High School. Following the video several graduates, staff members, and East Kentwood Principal Omar Bakri delivered speeches.

The theme of the evening was on the diverse yet inclusive nature of East Kentwood High School and the importance of the KPS vision of Excellence and Equity in Education. In recapping the evening, EKHS Principal Omar Bakri noted, "With a multicultural education, East Kentwood graduates are prepared to thrive and compete in a diverse and changing world."



In his speech to the graduates, Bakri urged graduates to go boldly forward into their futures, to share their voices, while standing firmly on the foundation of the unique education they received in Kentwood Public Schools. He encouraged the graduates to use their experiences at East Kentwood High School to further embrace differences while championing inclusivity.

Bakri is confident that the graduates will be successful.



If you are a current family, you will login to your existing ParentVUE account to begin the registration process. New families will first create a ParentVUE account to start the registration process. Please follow the directions to complete each section and upload the needed documents. Everyone who registers is required to show proof of residency.
